

28: “Take nothing but photographs ...

- 1) Don't collect rocks, shells, flowers, nests, living creatures, etc.
- 2) It costs us very little to make the planet a better place by picking up other people's rubbish.
- 3) If you put your rubbish in a communal rubbish bag, the bag will get too heavy and no-one will want to carry it.
- 4) If you dangle rubbish outside your pack, the rubbish bag will get snagged on something and rubbish will go everywhere.
- 5) Group latrines keep toilet waste in the one spot, which is better for privacy and for minimising impact.
- 6) The biological layer is generally regarded as 150ml (or 6 inches) deep.
- 7) Waterways can become contaminated by cat-holes dug in water courses.
- 8) Cat-holes should be a minimum of 100 metres from a water course.
- 9) Waterways can become contaminated with either germs or the chemicals in soaps if you wash your hands or dishes in creeks, rivers or lakes.
- 10) If there is no toilet nearby, it is okay to pee out of view, well away from others.
