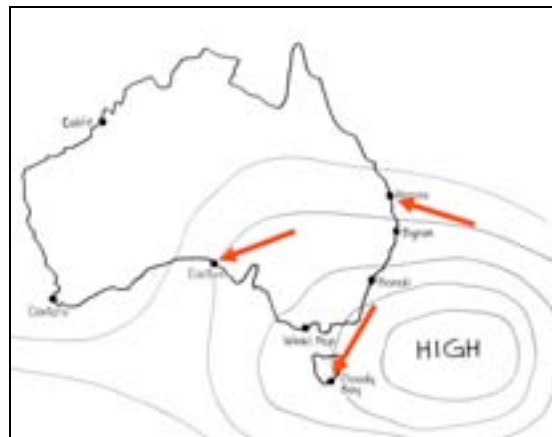
2. Conto's

2. Noosa, Byron & Bondi are all on-shore.

3. Warmer air is blowing down from the north.

4. Wind strength has decreased because the isobars are further apart.

#### extension questions

1. In settled conditions, the wind is more likely to be off-shore early in the morning, because as soon as the land mass heats up during the day on-shore sea breezes tend to spring up (e.g. the "Freo doctor").

2. Summer is the peak season up North for marine stingers like box jelly-fish. Some intrepid surfers go out and surf the big swells generated by tropical depressions, and **not all** of these intrepid surfers wear stinger suits. (They say you don't get stingers in surf!)

3. There are heaps of good surf websites and these days they can be accessed as touch phone apps. (The wipeout surf crew like the Hurley Surf app.)
